Civil Rights at 50: Looking Back, Looking Ahead *Civic leaders to discuss the next call to action*

MILWAUKEE, Wisconsin— Three of Milwaukee's innovative change-makers will discuss "Civil Rights at 50: Looking Back, Looking Ahead" at the Jewish Community Relations Council of the Milwaukee Jewish Federation's annual meeting on June 19.

Marcus White of the Greater Milwaukee Foundation, Reggie Moore of the Center for Youth Engagement, and Michele Bria of Journey House will explore today's urgent issues around civil rights. **The JCRC has asked these leaders to place themselves 50 years in the future and look back at today: What is the call to action?**
