
ALL HANDS UP FOR SHABBAT


An Interactive Bulletin Board


Objective: To have students become familiar with the sequence of Shabbat activities.

Bulletin board directions: Cut out letters to write the title, "ALL HANDS UP FOR SHABBAT," and cut a length of clothesline or heavy yarn. You will also need ten clothespins and bags to hold clothespins and "mittens." The bulletin board may then be assembled.


"Mitten" directions: Cut ten "mittens" out of tagboard, construction paper or regular paper. Color the Shabbat pictures, cut them out and paste them onto the "mittens." The "mittens" may be numbered in their correct sequence on the backs for self-correcting and then laminated, if desired.









Set a pretty table for Shabbat.




Light the Shabbat candles.




Say the Kiddush.



Bless the children.




Have a relaxing Shabbat afternoon.




Light the *Havdalah* candle.
