Traditions for Rosh Hashanah

- Blow the Shofar every day during Elul
- Hear the Shofar at synagogue on Rosh Hashanah
- Listen to the Torah reading
- Eat apples dipped in honey
- Eat the head of a fish
- Think about your mistakes and how to improve this year



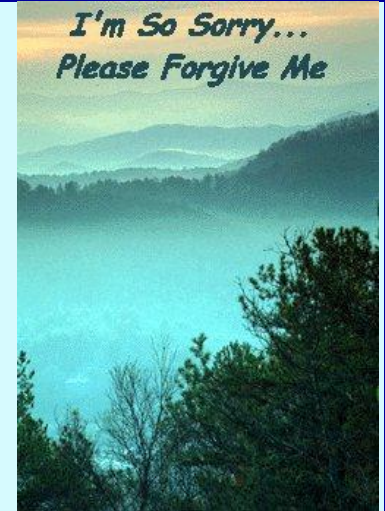
“Sin” in Hebrew:

Missing the bull's eye: חָטָא



During Elul we do Teshuvah

- 1) Say “I made a **mistake**”
- 2) Say “I’m sorry” to the **person**
- 3) **Fix** the mistake(s) you made
- 4) Apologize to **God**
- 5) Try not to make the same **mistake** again



What else can we do?

Repent (say sorry)- תְּשׁוּבָה •

Pray- תְּפִילָּה •

Give tzedakah- צְדָקָה •



תְּשׁוּבָה



- A service done on the 1st day of Rosh Hashanah
- We throw bread crumbs in a lake, river, or the ocean.
- They are a symbol= we throw away our mistakes
- Without teshuvah—they are just bread crumbs
